Requirements for writing the papers structured abstracts

Report structured abstract should be sent in one file (doc or docx format). It should contain the following:

1. The report title;
2. Author's first name, patronymic, surname; academic or professional affiliation;
3. Brief abstract, up to 500 spaced characters (4-6 sentences);
4. Key words (3-5 words);
5. The text of the report structured abstract should include the following sections:
 - 1) The report objective (statement of the conducted investigation objective/goal);
 - 2) Novelty/author's contribution (description of the report "value add" into the issues under investigation);
 - 3) Methodology (Characteristics of the research technique and analysis methods used in the research);
 - 4) Outcomes (description of the obtained research results and conclusions for academic researchers and/or practical persons);
 - 5) List of references.

The report structured abstract should contain 6000 characters as a minimum and maximum up to **7200 characters** (approximately 4 pages).

The report structured abstracts are accepted both in **Russian** and **English**.

The report structured abstracts must not currently be under consideration by another conference or have been presented elsewhere before.

Preparation of the report structured abstracts:

1. All paper margins set to 20mm on all sides;
2. Line spacing --- one and a half;
3. Full justification;
4. Times New Roman and 12 pt font size;
5. First line indent of each paragraph --1.5;
6. References and bibliographic list should be executed in accordance with GOST R 7.0.5-2008 (those out of the texts should be in square brackets);
7. Figures, graphs and charts should be easily distinguishable, in black and white or coloured mode. One figure should be sized at A4-size page limit. All figure details should be clearly seen if the figure is contracted.
8. Photos should have contrast image and should be in black and white version in electronic format.
9. All illustrations are numbered by the universal sequence numbering and are provided with straightforward captions.
10. Tables must be used only for providing data which cannot be described in the text. Tables are usually typed in one column, 74mm wide, and in two columns (160mm wide) in exceptional circumstances. Words in tables are to be written out, hyphenations are to be rightly arranged. Point isn't put at the end of a sentence in the table cell;
11. Illustrations and tables should be cited in the text;
12. File name should be indicated by the main author's family name.
